My biggest priority is to ensure that my daughter has the best education.



n 2014, I started volunteering as an editor for the public television station, Tisa 1. Three years later, I was employed as a presenter of the TV program Romano Jivipen (Roma Life). I also created a new television program, Romano Luve (Roma word), as a writer, editor, and journalist.

I was able to secure a scholarship from the Roma Education Fund (REF). At the time, REF offered scholarships to pursue law and economics studies, so I chose to study economics. When REF's priorities changed, I decided to pursue my dream to become a psychologist.



n high school, I did not have support. Out of 90 students, I was the only Roma in my school. Many classmates were curious about my origins, but I didn't experience prejudice.
